<u>Work Zone Safety – An Overview of Temporary Traffic Control and Safety for</u> <u>Water & Wastewater Workers</u>

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health reports that there are roughly 20,000 workers injured each year in construction site traffic incidents.

This half day remote course will provide an overview of what is meant by "Temporary Traffic Controls" for roadway utility projects. The session will review the "Bible" of traffic control: Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) which has been adopted by the Mass. Dept. of Transportation (MADOT). Attendees will be introduced to the important terminology and components of a temporary traffic control areas and the proper use of a variety of common types of equipment. Examples of common water and wastewater work will be presented along with a discussion of the best traffic safety implementation strategies.

This course is approved for **2.0 TCH** (Training Contact Hours) for both MA Water and Wastewater Operators.
